BM5 VISITS

The main topics of the visits were...

<u>Visit to Riga Technical School of Tourism and Creative Industry, State LLC</u> (RTRiT, secondary school)

ComPass delegation was welcomed by the team of RTRIT: Mrs. Gunta Šmaukstele, Deputy Director, Mrs. Solvita Siliṇa, Expert on education issues; Mrs. Anda Rezgale, Head of Tourism and Commercial Science Department and other representatives, who informed about RTRIT's concept, study programmes & internships, main activities and projects, achievement's (*see presentation slides in the Annex*).

Participants of the BM have gained also an insight into the practical learning of the school by enjoying a guide tour to learn about training facilities of RTRIT – classrooms equipped with commercial kitchens, laboratories for sweets and chocolate production, restaurant's dining rooms, bar and hotel rooms; lunch cooked and served by students of the schools at the restaurant's dining rooms as well as participating at the chocolate making workshop to get some knowledge and practical skills on how to cook chocolates sweets.



About RTRIT

RTRIT is state funded secondary vocational education institution providing recognized education programs at 2nd and 3rd national professional qualification levels for graduates of lower or upper secondary schools. It is one of the largest state vocational education institutions in Latvia educating 2000 students and employing 300 teachers and staff members.

RTRIT provides education in wide range of professions in such fields us catering, hospitality, design and fashion, tourism and retail (commercial science). Please see list of professions at the presentation slides below.

School offers flexible forms of tuition, dual education and work-based education; practical training is as close as possible to real-work-environment. On September 2013, RTRIT was granted status of professional education competence centre.

In order to facilitate initial vocational education quality and attractiveness, RTRIT actively implements European dimension in vocational education. It's a member of international non-governmental organizations AEHT (Association of European Hotel and Tourism Schools) and C.H.A.S.E. (Consortium of Hotel and Tourism





Schools in Europe). 18 vocational education institutions form 17 countries are members of C.H.A.S.E. organization, AEHT - 430 schools and non-governmental organizations from 44 countries.

On May 2016, School approved its "Internationalization Strategy 2016 - 2020" at the Ministry of Education. Beginning of 2016/2017 study year school was awarded with VET Mobility Charter.









BM 5 visit continued to the 2 different-type hotels, where internships of RTRIT students take place every year: Pullman Hotel and Konvēnta Sēta Hotel.

PULLMAN RIGA OLD TOWN Hotel

The Pullman Riga Old Town is a 5-star hotel that belongs to the international chain AccorHotels and Resorts. It is located in the historic building - a former Baron Munchausen's horse stable built in 1789 - and complemented by a modern attachment (opening of the hotel took place in 2016 after significant renovation work). Thereof, the interior of the hotel is designed in the equestrian theme, commemorating the famous 18th century's fantasy master Baron Munchausen, who had his stables there. Another characteristic of the hotel's style is the modern art and design.



The hotel has received various awards: in 2017, it has been recognised as the best project in the Baltic States (receiving "Baltic Real Estate Awards 2017"), received the main architectural award of the year in Latvia, won the award in the "Best Hotel Tourism & Resort" nomination and other. The hotel is also famous for various-type of events – conferences, public lectures, exhibits and others. Most of them are related to the art topic: http://pullmanriga.lv/category/news/

In Pullman Riga Old Town Hotel there are 155 guest rooms, a 24-hour restaurant, a bar, five meeting rooms, a private dining room, and two conference rooms for 150 and 200 guests, men's barbershop, as well as a fitness and recreation centre with a swimming pool. Rixwell Hotel Konventa Sēta

Comfort for an accessible price in the very heart of Riga

The Konventa Sēta (Convent Yard, Konventhof) is a 3-star of the Latvian chain Rixwell (currently comprising 6 hotels in the country). The hotel is a **complex of 7 buildings** (schematic plan) where the hotel is hosted is a national architectural monument located in one of the most ancient neighbourhoods in Riga.

Originally, on the site of the Convent Yard there was a castle that belonged to the Order of the Brothers of the Sword, built during the 13th century and destroyed during the Livonian civil war. Later on, in 1297 in the 13th century, the Holy Spirit's Convent was placed in this area. Afterwards, at the end of the 17th century, the so-called Holy Spirit's passage was introduced between Kaleju Street and Skarnu Street. During the 18th and 19th centuries, several warehouses were built there. St. George's Church — the chapel of the castle that belonged to the Order of the Brothers of the Sword — was retained.

The hotel offers 68 standard rooms, 47 apartment type rooms, 2 separate apartments, Junior Suite as well as 5 rooms for the event organisation.

At the premises of "Latvia 100 Info Point" that is located in the National Library of Latvia, participants of BM have met with a Head of Office "Latvia 100" Mrs. Linda Pavluta who introduced the concept of "Latvia 100" and Mr. Martins Engelis who shared the success story of the marketing campaign "Discover Latvia".

Project "Latvia 100" devote to Latvia's Centenary

Currently, one of the remarkable events in the history of Latvia is taking place. In 2018, the Republic of Latvia celebrates a hundred years since it became an independent state. In this regard, a 5-years long project "Latvia 100" with a budget nearly 60 million EUR was allocated. The celebration of anniversary continues from 2017 to 2021, when a large number of cultural, educational, diplomatic and multi-disciplinary events are planned. Latvia's official program includes more than 800 events in Latvia and all around the world. The culmination of the Centenary celebrations will take place on November 18, 2018, the date marking Latvia's 100th anniversary.

To provide information on all the events and activities, a digital platform "<u>Latvija 100</u>" has been developed where everyone is invited to add their own ideas, dedicated to Latvia and corresponding with the goals of the celebration.

Mrs. Pavļuta introduced also with the campaign where Latvian companies and various organisations where invited to use infographics "LV 100" in their products to disseminate the "celebration spirit" around the world.

Marketing campaign "Discover Latvia"

"Atklāj Latviju no jauna!" (Discover Latvia) is a marketing campaign, and brand at the same time, developed by Latvian Investment and Development Agency (LIAA) to facilitate local tourism all year around and to popularise less-know places, tourism objects and services of Latvia. Within the campaign, LIAA together with ambassador of the project Mr. Otomārs Pūce invites everyone to share a photo of the most beautiful, unusual and, specially, less-known places in the country at the social <u>platform Instagram</u>, <u>profile @enjoylatvija</u>, by adding hashtag **#atklaj** or **#enjoylatvia**.

Due to the Latvia 100's celebration, campaign "Discover Latvia" is dedicated to Latvian and Russian speaking population (to tackle also neighbouring countries). However, foreign guests are also using opportunity to tag various places of Latvia.





In a short period campaign has reached higher results than it was planned: 15 600 Facebook followers, 16 400 Instagram followers, 1600 pictures with #atklaj in only three months (see presentation slides in the Annex)

Following the presentations of the projects and intensive discussions, a guided visit around the National Library of Latvia took place.

National Library of Latvia (LNB)

The LNB, also locally known as the Castle of Light, was opened in 2014 on the banks of the Daugava River. The building, designed by Latvian-American architect Gunnar Birkerts, is shaped like a large mountain with a glass flame atop the structure. The glass flame makes up the 11th and 12th floors and offers a magnificent panorama of Old Town Riga on the river.

In Latvian folklore, a crystal mountain symbolizes the height of achievement – something not easily attainable but full of rewards for those who make the commitment to reach its peak. Latvian literature and folklore also speak of the 'castle of light' as a metaphor for wisdom that has been lost, but will rise again from the depths of the Daugava River after the Latvian people have overcome the intellectual darkness of war. It comes from an old legend in which a mystical castle symbolizing culture and knowledge sinks in a lake but will one day be rebuilt.

The LNB hosts a campaign "A Special Book for a Special Bookshelf" – where everyone are invited to donate one book of special importance to themselves together with a written personal message or story related to the book on its front page. The presented book is placed behind a glass construction (atrium) which serves as central element of the Library building.

Under one glass roof, the multi-functional facility houses over 1000 reading places, shelf space for the library's entire active collection (over 6 million items), extensive provision for research, a modern conference centre and exhibition area. In addition, Library pays attention to the <u>accessibility for people with special needs</u>. All the reading rooms, event spaces and services – is accessible to all visitors, also to people with special needs, including those with reduced mobility. Visually impaired and blind people may be accompanied by their guide dogs.

Hotel Relais Le Chevalier

Opened in 2017, a small luxury boutique in the heart of Old Town (no stars but is considered as 5* hotel). Relais le Chevalier is located in one of the most famous medieval buildings of Old Riga, also known as "a house with a horseshoe" due to the legend, which says, that Peter the Great's horse once lost it shoe here and dwellers of the house kept it for luck. Renovated façade of the building hides inside an impressive glass and mirrored atrium, which stretches to the roof.

The interior of the hotel is done by French and Italian designers, and the name, which literary means Knight's Inn, bringing s back to the mysterious medieval France. In the boutique hotel, following the format's rules, each floor has its own colour scheme. Rooms overlook a pedestrian street of the Old Town or the inner courtyard that has been turned into an atrium.

The Relais has 23 elegant rooms, skilfully created thanks to a careful division of the floors available so as to offer a full range of facilities; despite the limited space available, each one has been designed to appear as roomy as possible, by creating a natural light effect inside. Inside of the hotel, a bar and shop with production of various design objects is available.

Kalnciems Quarter

Kalnciema Quarter, located on the left bank of the Daugava River, is the complex of renovated wooden buildings on the corner of Kalnciems and Melnsils streets with a 19th century wooden architectural landmark, which was built in the style of late western European Classicism.

The revival of Kalnciems Quarter began in 2001 and now it's open for visiting the six restored wooden houses which surround a small apple orchard. In the renovation process of the buildings, traditional materials and technologies were used, while at the same time the houses have been adapted for the rhythm and comfort of modern life. It is famous for regularly hosting events for families and children, art exhibitions, plays, open-air concerts, and educational events, weekly markets with production from local farmers and artisans, food festivals. The Kalnciems Street Quarter has also been included in the Latvian Cultural Canon.

Street Food Festival

Since 2017, the Street Food Festival is the one of the regular events in Kalnciema Quarter. It's organised every Wednesday from May to September, where it's possible to enjoy a variety of street food prepared by professionals and enthusiasts, while at the same time enjoying a glass of good wine and some music outdoors with family or friends.

Riga Central Market

Riga Central Market was opened in 1930 after the construction work of five pavilions which were used as German army zeppelin (airship) hangars during the WWI. It was recognized as the largest and most technologically advanced market in Europe. During the war, the Third Reich made use of two pavilions as an automobile repair shop, and nearby was a large area where firewood was stored. In 1949, Central Market was renamed the Central Kolhoz Market, and the Soviet press lavished much praise for it, calling it the best in all of the USSR.

Since 1995, the Central Market has been a joint stock company with 100% of its shares owned by Riga City Council. It occupies 72.3 thousand m² of space and has over 3000 trade stands. The market has five pavilions in the historical buildings – meat pavilion, dairy pavilion, gastronomy pavilion, vegetable pavilion and fish pavilion as well as open-air market mainly around the pavilions.

In 1997, the vast territory of Riga Central Market was added to the UNESCO World Heritage list. Riga Central Market is unique not only with its pavilions but also with its old warehouses or the so-called Spikeri (from German Spéicher), which have now been turned into a hip arts&entertainment quarter (creative quarter). In 2019, at the Gastronomy pavilion will be opened the first Gastro Market (food hall with restaurants) in Baltic States.

Jūrmala city

Visit to the Jūrmala city was devoted to such topics as **health tourism in Latvia** and **accessible tourism to all in Jūrmala**. Under the guidance of Mrs. Gunta Ušpele, Head of the Latvian Health Tourism Cluster, participants of the BM5 visited Jūrmala Hospital to learn about Latvian Health Tourism Cluster and medical opportunities in Latvia, Baltic Beach Hotel and nature sites of the city – Jūrmala open air museum, Ragakāpa nature park, Lielupe beach and Ķemeri National park and big Bo.

Jūrmala is the biggest beach resort city in Baltic States, surrounded by water from two sides - the city's southern side borders with the coasts of the Lielupe River for 30 kilometres, but the city's northern edge - with the Gulf of Riga for 26 kilometres along the white sand beaches, extensive pine forests. It is located only 25 km from capital city Riga. Wooden architecture is one of the distinguishing features of Jūrmala, in particular, quaint homes with decorative towerlets and glazed verandas.

The center of Jūrmala is located in the Majori station and it has the main street of the city – Jomas street. With a population of over 57 thous., Jūrmala leads the WHO Healthy City movement in Latvia offering therapy, social and medical rehabilitation as well as tourism.

From April 1 until September 30 there is an entrance fee obliged, if you are travelling by car (2 EUR per 1 day). The profit gained from the entrance fee is used for city development and municipal parking lots in the city are free of charge.



Accessibility to all

There is a number of beaches adapted for people with special needs, having exit paths suitable for wheelchairs and special changing rooms for people with reduced mobility. Some of them have special floating chairs offered for disabled people free of charge (for individual use and with an assistant). Additionally, there are built and reconstructed walkways and sidewalks feature integrated tactile markings that aid navigation for the visually impaired. Also, the city's traffic lights are equipped with audible signals. 10 train stations in Jūrmala are accessible to wheelchair users

In 2017, it has received an <u>EU Access City Award</u> for its commitment to making its tourist and seaside areas more accessible to visitors and city residents alike (click to see <u>VIDEO</u>).

Medical Tourism in Latvia

Benefits of Latvian medical and health tourism products in comparison with Eastern and Western medical tourism markets where equivalent services can be received, are: high product and service quality, professional medical staff, latest medical equipment to ensure services, without long queues and at competitive prices altogether are essential prerequisites for the patient to decide on receiving services outside their home country, and choosing Latvia. Other significant factors: unique natural healing resources of Latvia and its temperate maritime climate that provide unique opportunities for treatment of various diseases, speeding up the recovery process, providing beauty treatments, rehabilitation, as well as recreation.

In addition, cluster partners are able to provide both English and Russian speaking medical staff, so there is no language barrier, and free communication on health issues gives patient a sense of security, trust and confidence that a proper choice has been made to receive high-quality services from the professional medical staff of Latvia.

Latvian Health Tourism Cluster (LHTC)



LHTC was established in 2012 to provide high quality medical services to foreign patients as well as locals. There are 60 cluster members, wide variety of health tourism providers: government, municipality and regional hospitals, private clinics, rehabilitation centers, resort hotels, travel agencies, educational and research institutions. Travel agencies and educational institutions provide trainings to members of the cluster to make health tourism processes more efficient, and subsequently reach better results. Membership in LHTC gives an opportunity to improve cooperation among health tourism providers, to organize common marketing activities, to invent and market integrated, innovative tourism products and services, and to make them more available to locals as well as foreign tourists.

The Jurmala Hospital, a is a multi-profile and emergency medical institution which provides health care services to patients from all areas in Latvia, regardless of the health services' regional distribution, as well as to foreign patients. Jurmala Hospital offers its patients specifically developed health check-up programmes so that anyone can check and follow up their health status within 24 hours. The hospital offers maternity services, delivery in comfortable suites and water births as well. It is well-known for weight-loss surgery for patients suffering from chronic obesity.



Baltic Beach Hotel & SPA



BBH is a 5-star hotel nestled directly on the shore of the Baltic Sea has a unique location in Jurmala amidst the dunes and lushly pine-trees. Offering direct access to the fully equipped private beach with catering service, it is ideally located in the heart of Jurmala within walking distance to main cultural and recreational institutions, railway station, restaurants, shops.





It has several restaurants, a 24-hour bar and a summer terrace on the beach is available for hotel guests, SPA complex, conference rooms banqueting facilities as well as playground and different activities for kids. Two rooms are available for people *with mobility disabilities* and ramps heading to the restaurant and conference rooms.



SPA BalticBeach gained the status of certified medical facility, has over 4.810-m2 area and offers more than 400 treatments & relaxation options. It has a unique in Baltics 25-meter long swimming pool with the heated seawater, Russian bath complex "The Banja" (high amounts of heat generated by a stove made of 16 tons of Karelian granite, a special banya "climate" ("light steam") and the aroma of freshly baked rye bread) and SPA recreation complex "The Garden" (is a water relaxation centre that consists of a Jacuzzi, an amber sauna, an "adventure" shower, and Old Wood sauna, ice jets, a pool with counter current, a hammam, Rasul (Oriental apartments for four, with a starry sky), a Kneipp pool) and modern gym with cardio- and heavyweight machines.

Nature parks of Jurmala

Ragakāpa Nature Park

Ragakāpa is a specially protected territory of nature formed in order to preserve the dunes covered with an ancient pine forest and the biodiversity on the sea coast. The nature park contains stands of pines that are up to 340 years old as well as rare plant and protected bird species. Trails are enhanced by safe and comfortable stairs, benches, informative signs and stands. Ragakāpa walking trail has four separate trails – the Scenic Trail, Insect Trail, Pine Trail and Plant Trail.



Jūrmala open -air museum

Located at the foot of the dune "Ragakāpa", the Jūrmala Open Air Museum is an attractive way to discover the daily life of fishermen at the turn of the 20th century. Here, you can climb on the decks of two authentic fishing boats, upon prior request, try your skills at the rope-making workshop, and visit authentic houses of fishermen. On Thursdays in summer, the museum hosts fish-smoking events where local fishermen show and tell about the traditional ways to smoke.

Kemeri National Park

The KNP (established in 1997) aims to preserve the values of nature, culture, history and resortology as well as to promote non-depleting economic activity, tourism and environmental education. National Park covers the area of 38,165 ha. It is the third largest Latvian national park (after Gauja and Razna National Parks). Great Kemeri Bog - part of the KNP

The Great Kemeri Bog is one of the main sulphur water producing swamps around Kemeri. During the passage of migratory birds, the bog is an excellent place for bird viewing. The Great Kemeri Bog Boardwalk will make your way easy into this otherwise hardly accessible deep pools, tiny dark lakes, undersized pine trees, and land of moss.
