Management of City Forest in City Community Celje

Introduction

- Celje, the city of Counts: The forth largest city in Slovenia (37.188 people) with reach cultural heritage within green environment
- Urban forest a source of energy
- The Urban forest of Celje an exemplary case of sustainable management, protection and conservation of forest areas in the immediate vicinity of the city
- Developing the forests in the city's vicinity in the terms of its ecological and social function since 1997: Infrastructure development, purchasing of private forests and adapted management

Urban Forest of Celje strategy Plan 1996: Protection by law, planting of trees annually Improvement of ownership Adapted management Infrastructure development Structural financement

paved width: 2,5 - 3 m multiple use

Skidding Trail unpaved width: up to 2,5 m multiple use

The Tree House

GREEN4GREY – FOREST FOR CITIES (INTERREG SLOVENIA-CROATIA PROJECT)

- Revitalization of degraded forest areas Tree house, children's playground and equipped forest paths
- Raising public awareness of natural and cultural assets of forests through education and promotion

Tree House

- The house is made of Douglas fir, felled in this urban forest and attached to 6 trees
- Observatory a platform for educational and cultural activities, exhibitions, contemplation, team building, events, etc.
- Forest lab education through experience





Nature forest experience – forest pedagogy

Educational programmes encourage the experience of nature on the topics of:

- Diversity and functioning of the forest ecosystem, comparing it with urban, park and grassland ecosystems
- Tree and animal species in forests,
- Forest reserves and primary forests
- The functions of forests and their importance for society and human health
- Principles and history of Slovenian forest management
- Sustainable use of forest resources

94 ha of well preserved forest area,
12 well-maintained with total length of 14 km equipped walking trails
1 Adopted Strategy on forest management, protection and conservation
2 Decrees on the protection of forest and trees
1 Educational multi-purpose observatory - tree house
The number of visitors to the forest is increasing year by year: 15,000 in 2000 and 65,000 in 2018 (The Slovenia Forest Service)

- Urban Forest Association for the Sustainable Development of Urban Nature (NGO)


Main beneficiaries:
