


Maramureş County Council (Romania) – Inter-institutional Cooperation

4th Transnational Learning Meeting combined with the Study Visit









Maramures County is situated in the North West of Romania and faced challenges of refugees' crisis since the beginning of the conflict that disturbs the normal life in our neighbouring country, Ukraine.





"The humanitarian crisis in Ukraine has been going on for months, during which all key factors have been mobilized in Maramures to provide needed support to our neighbours across Tisa. In this supporting campaign we have been joined by partners from other European Union countries and, together with our local partners, NGOs, business representatives, civil society and local governments, we continue to support Ukraine everyday" said Mr. Ionel Bogdan, the president of Maramures County Council.











- Maramureș County is part of the North-West Region of Romania which includes 6 counties: Bihor, Bistriţa-Năsăud, Cluj, Maramureș, Satu Mare and Sălaj.
- Maramureş County borders Ukraine to the north; to the east with Suceava county; to the south with the counties of Bistriţa-Năsăud, Cluj, Sălaj; and to the west with Satu Mare county.
- The area of the county is 6,304 km2 (2.6% of the total area of the country), being located on the 15th place in terms of area, among the counties of the country.

- Maramureş County has the longest border with Ukraine of 163.1 kilometers and
- 1 border crossing point at Sighetu Marmații Solotvino on a single-lane wooden bridge.































In the beginning of the conflict, thousands of people, especially women and children, fled Ukraine and entered daily in Maramures through the border crossing point from Sighetu Marmaţiei, finding in our county support and humanitarian assistance. Maramures County Council, as local authority at county level, is acting as catalyst factor for Maramures community to help people who had to leave their country, their homes and families to flee from war and destruction.




















A working group for crisis management that was created, involving representatives of Maramures County Council, Prefecture and Inspectorate for Emergency Situations, coordinates at the county level all supporting actions for Ukraine and for refugees, making easier their stay or transit through Romania.

Since the beginning of the armed conflict, hundreds of people from Maramures have shown lots of empathy with the refugees, offering freely accommodation, food, transportation and hundreds of young volunteers were actively involved in these supporting actions.









The first measures covered the primary needs of refugees, providing necessary food, clothes, and hygiene supplies and solving medical emergencies. In partnership with the Inspectorate for Emergency Situations and the Municipality of Sighetu Marmatiei, a **refugee camp** with tents and containers has been set up within the Municipal Stadium of Sighetu Marmaţiei.

Complementing the national initiatives, the Maramures County Council demonstrated its commitment by allocating a substantial 1 million euros to manage the refugee crisis situation.

Three logistic centres have been established in Baia Mare, Sighetu Marmaţiei and Halmeu, for managing donations received from local, national and international donors, including donors from twinned regions with Maramures and other EU partners. Many young volunteers worked there for receiving, selecting and distributing the donations.









From the Humanitarian hubs located in Halmeu and Sighetu Marmaţiei, more than 100 trucks as humanitarian convoys transported tonnes of goods and first aid supplies to our twinned regions Transcarpathia and Ivano-Frankivsk, and other regions from Ukraine that have turned to Maramures for help.











In partnership with local and international NGOs, including UNICEF, Red Cros, and our Child Protection Institution, we set up the "Blue Do—Integrated Centre of Assistance and Support" for refugees and their children at the border point Sighetu Marmatiei. This was the **first Blue Dot facility** opened in Romania.















- Maramures County Council has added a dedicated online platform to this Blue Dot facility, which enables refugees to access accommodation and transportation in real time.
- This platform's primary purpose was to connect the needs of those fleeing the war with the resources identified by our crisis management unit. It also ensures the traceability of the refugees within our territory.
- Safety and quick response to the crisis were our primary concerns when dealing with this unprecedented situation.











Maramures County Council allocated 300.000 euros to finance local NGOs within the county project "Cooperation on increasing the operational capacity at the level of Maramures County in order to ensure efficient and unitary adequate humanitarian assistance for refugees/persons entering the territory of Romania and for citizens and public authorities on the territory of Ukraine."













Under the coordination of the crisis-working group, over 30 NGOs have been involved in the project of Maramures County dedicated to adequate humanitarian assistance for the Ukraine crisis, within all necessary operations at the logistic centres and at the Blue Dot, for: managing donations, receiving, registering and guiding the refugees;

Ensuring/facilitating translation, primary needs, medical care, meals, accommodation, transport, child protection, psychological assistance, legal advice and useful information.


All 30 NGOs actively engage young volunteers, who are crucial in supporting the refugees.
















Foreign citizens coming in Maramures from the armed conflict areas of Ukraine, benefit from free of charge railway transportation on the territory of our country. Two free international rail transport corridors have been created, with departure from Sighetu Marmaţiei, on daily basis.

The refugees also benefit from free internet through the Wi-Fi network provided by a national operator. The company has also offered free mobile cards with internet benefits and national and international minutes valid in the EU and Ukraine in the first months.

Maramures County Council offered free COVID-19 testing for all the refugees and medical care in our hospitals through our local medical programs.













For more than 500 Ukrainian children and their attendants, we have facilitated accommodation and meals in Maramures on their way to Turkey, with the support of our task force especially set up to deal with Ukrainian minors who arrive in Romania without parents or come from Ukrainian placement centers.

The Inclusion of Ukrainian children within our educational system represents another action to support refugees staying in Maramures for longer period of time. Around 200 children have been included in the educational system of Maramures county, within classes with teaching program in Ukrainian language, taking into consideration that a strong minority of Ukrainians live in Maramures.







Managing the crisis of Ukrainian refugees Maramures in County in addition means, accommodation, meals or transport, social and psychological counselling, dialogue and finding occupational solutions for people who choose to stay longer in our county.

In this respect, we have organised meetings with refugees and local companies, in partnership NGOs, the Chamber of Commerce Maramures, and the Employment Maramures, Agency to present national employment and local conditions and identify iob opportunities.




"Blue Dot Mobile" project is an extension of Blue Dot in the field, facilitating and improving the social inclusion of Ukrainians settled in Maramures.

A summer camp was held in Maramures for 12 children from the conflict area, settled in Tyachiv city from Transcarpathia Region, accompanied by 2 adults, for one week, in July 2022.

The camp was organised by Maramures County Council in partnership with YMCA Baia Mare, in the framework of the program initiated by the European Committee of the Regions and the Association of Ukrainian Cities.

Besides the visits at museums, planetarium and playgrounds, the Ukrainian children have been involved in fun and non-formal and educational activities by the young volunteers from YMCA.















A second summer camp took place in Maramures in 7-13 July 2023, that was organized in collaboration with the County School Inspectorate of Maramureş county and it was attended by 30 children, aged 9-16 and 5 companions from the town of Brovari, near Kiev.

With the financial support of the Maramureş County Council, which allocated the sum of 50,000 lei, the Maramureş County School Inspectorate organized a camp with a diverse and attractive program, which included educational and recreational activities, while also encouraging the artistic creativity of the participants.


